Nutrition Edge in Alice Springs & Tennant Creek

Nutrition Edge workshops were run in Alice Springs on 5-6 February and in Tennant Creek on 9-10 February. The workshops were presented by Matt Ahern and Joe Miller of Symbio Alliance Consulting.

Those in attendance covered a wide range of material relevant to cattle nutrition including:

- Ruminant nutrition
- Principles of pasture growth and quality
- Grazing management and animal performance
- Mineral nutrition of livestock
- Managing nutritional deficiencies.

In the final session, producers worked through nutritional problems they face on their stations. This was a noticeable change to previous workshops which involved more theory and meant there was less time available to tackle local challenges.

Producers and DPIFM staff who attended the workshop felt that it was money well spent as they were now equipped with the necessary tools to manage their cattle's nutrition at a level that was more efficient and profitable for their business.

Thankyou to Ian McLean for organising these two courses. Thankyou also to those who attended. The workshops were most enjoyable and very interesting because of your attendance.

Barkly Rangeland Management Courses

The Tennant Creek Primary Industry group will be continuing to offer the popular Barkly Rangeland Management Course (BRMC) to all stations across the Barkly and Gulf regions in 2006.

The aim of these courses is to provide a flexible training program to station staff to add to their understanding of, and to stimulate their interest in, the sustainable management of rangeland resources for beef cattle production.

These courses have been developed to present station staff with useful information relevant to their work in the pastoral production industry.

Some of the topics covered by the course content include:

- Pasture plant identification and dynamics
- Integrated rangeland management
- Pasture monitoring and assessment
- Fire as a pasture management tool
- Cattle nutrition management
- Identification and management of poisonous plants and noxious weeds
- Biodiversity awareness and management.

Courses have been run successfully across our region since 1999. They have been developed by DPIFM and DNRETA using information based on local research.

Typically, courses have been run over two days on the station incorporating theory presentations and in-the-paddock demonstrations from DPIFM staff. However, the courses can be tailored to meet the particular needs and interests of each station.

DEPARTMENT OF PRIMARY INDUSTRY, FISHERIES AND MINES

Compulsory ChemCert 3 for S7 Chemicals

From 1 January 2006, ChemCert level 3 or equivalent will be required for all new authorisations. Current S7 authorisations will not be affected.

Chemical products containing Chlorfenvinphos for control of buffalo fly and ticks are used extensively by cattle producers in the Top End (Supona, Barricade S, Defiance S etc) and are S7 chemicals.

S7 chemicals have a high potential for causing harm at low exposure and require special precautions in manufacture, handling or use.

For this reason Department of Primary Industry, Fisheries and Mines (DPIFM) has introduced a compulsory ChemCert level 3 or equivalent.

This means you must have a current ChemCert level 3 or equivalent if you wish to possess and use S7 chemicals. An S7 product containing Chlorfenvinphos may be used in cattle if you are directly supervised by a person with a current S7 authorisation, or are authorised yourself.

Options for providing ChemCert in Tennant Creek are currently under consideration, but a ChemCert course will be held on 16 and 17 February 2006 in Darwin.

All efforts are made to provide the service on the requested day and time if this prior notice is given.

Prior notice enables efficient deployment of staff resources and also helps your local Regional Veterinary Officers and Regional Stock Inspectors deliver the required services.

Investigation of disease is excluded from this general principle.

Workshops and Courses

There are a range of workshops and courses Tennant Creek DPIFM is keen to promote and host in 2006. There are sure to be more courses offered throughout the coming year.

Grazing For Profit Course: This course is facilitated by Rural Consultancy Services. It provides an interactive insight into the factors that may affect your grazing enterprise.

All aspects of the enterprise are considered from many perspectives in this specifically-designed course. A Grazing For Profit course has been scheduled to run in Alice Springs on 15-22 March 2006, however a course could be run in Tennant Creek if there was sufficient interest. A minimum of 12 participants is needed to run the course in Tennant Creek.

Jabiru Management Skills Development Course: This course is aimed at anyone with a responsibility to recruit and manage staff. It covers many aspects of human resource management including recruitment, induction, communication, performance reviews, delegation and conflict resolution.

This course is run by skilled, experienced trainers from Jabiru Human Resource Services over 2 ½ days. To run this course in Tennant Creek we will need 12 to 15 participants.

Barkly Rangeland Management Course:

This course is aimed at station staff keen to develop their skills and knowledge in the area of land and production system management on the Barkly Tableland.

The BRMC has been designed to provide station staff with a broad range of information relating to their work in rangeland production systems. The course is delivered by DPIFM staff and can be held on station. They can be arranged at most times of the year.

ITEC EMPLOYMENT WAGE ASSISTANCE

Wage assistance is an employment incentive program available from ITEC Employment. It helps employers employ new staff by

subsidising the costs associated with employing and training new staff.

Wage Assistance provides employers with financial incentive to provide ongoing employment for eligible job seekers from ITEC Employment.

Indigenous Wage Assistance (IWS) for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders may also be available in conjunction with the above ITEC Employment Wage Assistance for eligible ITEC clients.

Wage Assistance is an incentive paid directly by the Department of Employment and Workplace Relations (DEWR) to help Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander job seekers find long-term jobs.

- Employers who employ eligible job seekers can receive up to \$4400 over 26 weeks for ongoing full-time work and \$2200 for ongoing part-time work exceeding 15 hours per week.
- Eligible job seekers are provided with a blue wage assistance card by Centrelink.
- Eligible job seekers are also given brown wage assistance cards to leave with employers.
- Applications for Wage Assistance must be submitted by employers within 28 days of the job seeker commencing employment.

The NT Rural College is seeking expressions of interest from those wanting to do a short course in cattle pregnancy diagnosis.



NT Bushfires Council News

This year's fire season has been extremely quiet with only a handful of fires reported. This was because of the significant rainfall brought on by the monsoon rains and the vast country that experienced wildfire last year.

There have been some outbreaks caused by lightning in the early part of the season, mainly around the Mittiebah Ranges and a few around Elliott and Creswell Downs. These fires were contained within previously burnt country and allowed to continue to burn to improve and promote fresh feed. Stations monitored the fires and carried out any work to keep them within the containment lines.

Bushfires Council staff are asking station managers and community leaders to provide them with information on wildfire outbreaks and fuel reduction burns so we can better map and keep current records of fire activity in the regions. Once complete, this information will be made available to stations and communities in the form of upto-date maps showing fire scar history, areas of concern and significant assets. This information will be on hand at the stations and communities.

Funding through the Natural Disaster Mitigation Program has been applied for. If the funding is approved it will allow more training courses to be held with stations and remote Aboriginal communities across the Barkly and Elliott/Wauchope regions. Over the next 12 months we are also working with station managers to produce strategic fire management plans for stations and communities in the regions. We hope to add these into a regional fire management plan for Elliott/Wauchope and the Barkly.

Over the past six months a number of Wildfire Level 1 training courses have been conducted with 40 station and community members. Again, we are asking communities and managers to plan for upcoming training courses.


Live Cattle Exports via Darwin Port - FEBRUARY 2006








TOTAL Live Cattle Exports thru Port of Denwin 2005 v 2006


