WHAT & WHO

The Northern Australia Climate Program (NACP) and Meat & Livestock Australia (MLA) have developed a Profitable Grazing Systems (PGS) climate specific training course called Rain Gauge: Forecasting for a Profitable Future.

- Strategies for managing pasture response and grazing pressures in unfavorable seasons
- How to integrate climate information and forecasts into land management plans including tools to mitigate risks associated with establishing improved pastures
- > The impacts of thermal stress on livestock
